



Jumping Through Loops: Little-known Strategy Adds Free Side Trip — Plus Lowers Your Fare

December 2020

FCF's side hustle delivers the goods – even during the lockdown era.

It's been almost a year since we discussed our Stopover Loophole Strategy (SLS). But it's time to bring it back. We've just found some great SLS fares that 2021 travelers should consider jumping on right now.

SLS Crash Course

What is the Stopover Loophole Strategy again? Here's how it works. A stopover is a planned stop of more than four hours (domestic) or 24 hours (international) between flight segments on a trip. But longer stopovers are sometimes allowed for free (or a very small fee) – i.e. these allow you to enjoy a “second destination” for

several days or much longer – most often in the applicable airline’s hub city. This presents an interesting opportunity for business travelers and/or those wanting to add a little extra pleasure to their trip.

That’s because the stopover can be turned into a vacation if you’re on a business trip or a second vacation if you’re already traveling for pleasure. So the SLS strategy allows you to add a bucket list destination for a fraction of the normal price, or even free in many cases! And on top of that, the flight to your original destination can even be less. See some examples of this below.

Savings That Scream “Why Didn’t I Know About This?!”

If you play it right, this cool strategy opens up the world for way less. I’m talking Business Class fares to the far-flung reaches of the planet for under \$3,100; that’s two destinations for the price of one.

The following SLS options involve Europe and Africa. Here are two scenarios that demonstrate this opportunity:

Scenario #1: You are going to Africa, and you’d take a side trip in Europe if it were free or cheap, or actually lowered your fare to Africa.

Scenario #2: You are going to Europe, and you’d take a side trip in Africa if it were free or cheap, or actually lowered your fare to Europe.

Either way, the SLS works hard to save you money.

Dan’s Pyramid Scheme

Dan from Dallas has always dreamt of seeing the pyramids in Egypt. If Dan pays a regular round-trip fare in Business Class on United to Cairo, he’d have to dish out \$3,209. On the other hand, if Dan goes via Frankfurt, he gets to add Frankfurt onto the trip for a total cost of \$2,459 – a \$750 savings. More for less. We love that equation.

While that’s the biggest saving we could find, the chart below shows a lot of other options. Many of them add a city for less, about the same, or only a bit more. In all cases, it’s definitely something worth considering for your next trip.

Great Deals on Loop(hole)

As you can see, you either pay up to just \$250 more for a whole extra city OR you pay up to \$750 *less*. In those cases **you're essentially being paid** for the privilege of visiting another city. You also have the choice of spending a short layover in the European city on the way to Africa, or a long layover. Make it a vacation in itself – it's entirely up to you.

LOYALTY TIP: The North African trips use Star Alliance airlines, while the South African ones work when using Virgin (but not SkyTeam). South Africa works best with Oneworld. Loyalty-free agents can skim the cream from SLS, in other words.

Got Another Place in Mind?

If the cities featured aren't the ones you have in mind, remember that travel within Europe is inexpensive and there are many options to get around. For example, Berlin is just an hour's flight from Frankfurt, and it's about the same distance to Vienna. Also, play around with dates and itinerary combinations for many other opportunities we haven't highlighted.

I hate to be the guy that says, "I told you so," but as we mentioned for American [here](#), and Delta [here](#) and [here](#), cheap awards are drying up faster than a wet sock on a Madrid sidewalk.

That said, there's a new top *hombre* in town when it comes to cheap awards that are actually bookable now: Iberia (*cue dramatic Ennio Morricone music. And yes, we know he's Italian but it's the right vibe*).

IBERIA: PUNCHING ABOVE ITS BAGGAGE WEIGHT

Iberia, Líneas Aéreas de España, S.A. Operadora, Sociedad Unipersonal, or **Iberia** for short (thankfully), is Spain's national carrier. For European-bound Business Class travelers, it's an airline that's definitely worth running your *ojos* over. Here are a few topline reasons before we drill down to an airline versus airline battle, specifically against the big three U.S. carriers.

Iberia operates a flight-distance award chart, so the miles required are based on the length of the flight. Boston, Chicago, and New York Business Class departures to Madrid cost 100,000 miles round-trip in peak season and 68,000 in low season. Los Angeles and Miami are 125,000 and 85,000 miles, respectively.

LOW TAXES

On their New York-London route, British Airways' taxes can be \$1,400! Iberia is a welcome exception. Taxes come to about \$196 from East Coast gateways and \$238 from the West Coast.

EASY ACCESS TO IBERIA MILES

The airline is an Amex and Chase transfer partner.

Iberia's U.S. gateways to Madrid are Boston, Miami, Chicago, New York, Los Angeles, and San Francisco.

Now, let's head to the bullring for some head-to-head airline battles for context.

DEAL PERSPECTIVE #1: IBERIA VS. DELTA

Delta charges 250,000 to 620,000 miles to fly Business Class New York-Madrid. But on Iberia, that flight goes for as low as 68,000 miles — that's almost **four tickets for less than the price of one** with Delta.

DEAL PERSPECTIVE #2: IBERIA VS. AMERICAN

American charges 120,000 to 270,000 miles in Business Class New York-Madrid, while Iberia charges as few as 68,000 miles. That's only 8,000 more miles than AA charges for economy. So you're essentially getting an **upgrade for 8,000 miles**, and chances are good that you'll get that upgrade because Iberia now offers up to 95% more award space than American. Wow and wow. Iberia 2, U.S. airlines 0.

DEAL PERSPECTIVE #3: IBERIA VS. UNITED

United charges 120,000 miles in Business Class New York-Madrid, while Iberia charges as few as 68,000. That's only 8,000 more miles than UA charges for economy. Again, that equates to getting almost a free

upgrade. And you'll likely get it because Iberia now offers 70%+ more award space than United. That's a clean sweep in my mind: Iberia cruises to a crushing 3-0 win in the bullring.

The Secret to Getting to Asia When Round-Trip Awards Aren't Available

Having trouble booking a round-trip mileage award? Consider a one-way ticket instead.

If you find you're having a hard time booking round-trip award travel to Asia (and who isn't?), don't despair. Let one-way award tickets come to the rescue.

First, let's just recap when one-way tickets are the way to go:

- When a round-trip saver award is not available.
- When you want the best routing and best premium seats.

- When a partner saver round-trip award is not available on your preferred carrier but is available with the partner's own mileage program.
- When the [Stopover Loophole Strategy \(SLS\) to Asia](#) saves you so much money all you need is a one-way ticket to kick it off.

The idea is simple and it works wherever you're going: just divide your itinerary in two and search for the best deal on each leg.

I almost never book round-trip mileage awards because I'm usually going to multiple destinations, and/or I'm not planning to return to where I started. So there's rarely an ideal departure-return pairing on the same airline because with each different route I'll likely find better seats and/or schedules via different programs.

That's the key: getting the best option on each independent leg rather than on the round-trip as a whole.

BEST ONE-WAY DEALS TO ASIA

[Air Canada](#): With dynamic award pricing, Air Canada flights range from 52,000 to 150,000 and their partners start at 55,000 miles one-way in Business Class and 90,000 to 200,000 miles in First Class while partners are 90,000 one-way. This includes airline partners such as Singapore and United. If you don't have these miles, you can get them through Amex Rewards point transfers. (Go [here](#) and [here](#) for some of the recent Business Class award availability alerts).

[Air France](#): Air France and partner flights start at 85,000 miles one-way in Business Class. It includes airline partners such as Delta, Japan Airlines, Korean, and Singapore. If you don't have miles, you can get them through Amex Rewards point transfers.

[Alaska](#): The cost varies by route. The cheapest partner flights in Business Class to Asia are on Cathay Pacific for 50,000 miles while American's range from 60,000 to 70,000 miles. In First Class, American flights range from 80,000 to 110,000 miles while Cathay is just 70,000 miles. Japan Airlines ranges from 60,000 to 65,000 miles in Business Class and from 70,000 to 75,000 miles in First Class. Korean Air ranges from 105,000 to 120,000 miles in Business Class and Singapore Airlines from 80,000 to 100,000 miles in Business Class and from 110,000 to 130,000 miles in First Class.

[American](#): With dynamic award pricing, its flights and those with partners start at 60,000 miles one-way in Business Class. Partners include Cathay Pacific and Japan Airlines. First Class starts at 80,000 miles one-way.

[Cathay Pacific](#): The cost varies by route, starting at 70,000 miles one-way (Los Angeles-Hong Kong) in Business Class and 110,000 miles in First Class. On American, it's 75,000 miles in Business Class and 120,000 miles in First. FYI, Amex points transfer to Cathay. (Go [here](#), for a recent Business Class alert and [here](#), and [here](#) for some of the recent First Class award availability alerts).

[Japan Airlines](#): The least expensive flights are to/from Japan: 50,000 miles in Business Class and 70,000 in First. Oneworld partner awards vary and are higher than JAL's own. (Go [here](#) and [here](#) for some recent Business Class and [here](#), and [here](#) of the recent First Class award availability alerts).

United (does not offer a chart) has dynamic award pricing, with flights and those of their partners starting at 88,000 miles in Business Class and 121,000 miles in First Class, valid on United and Asiana, among other airlines. United is a Chase transfer partner.

[Singapore Airlines](#): Cost varies by route. The least expensive flight is Los Angeles-Tokyo for 92,000 miles in Business Class and 107,000 miles in First. Award cost on Star Alliance partners is higher. Amex Rewards members can transfer points to Singapore miles. (Go [here](#) and [here](#) for recent Business Class award availability alerts).

[Virgin Atlantic](#): Partner-flight cost varies, starting at 60,000 miles on Delta in Business Class. (Go [here](#) and [here](#) for some of the recent Business Class award availability alerts).

MULTIPLY YOUR CHANCES AT THE “CARD TABLE”

One of the best things you can do is to be in a credit card program that links to many different airline programs. It means you can get around the availability barriers that airlines put up -- sneaky critters that they are.

Like I always say, **options matter**.

Miracle Berth to Asia: FCF's Secret Strategy Now Prices Delta Flights 67% Cheaper Than Delta Charges

How Chase and Amex points players can get 3-for-1s on Business Class flights on Delta.

I feel your pain. In many ways, the airline performs operationally better than American and United. And, yes, we know that many of you live in a city that provides very few options other than Delta.

But I still have to write this subheadline (apologies if you feel a slight sting).

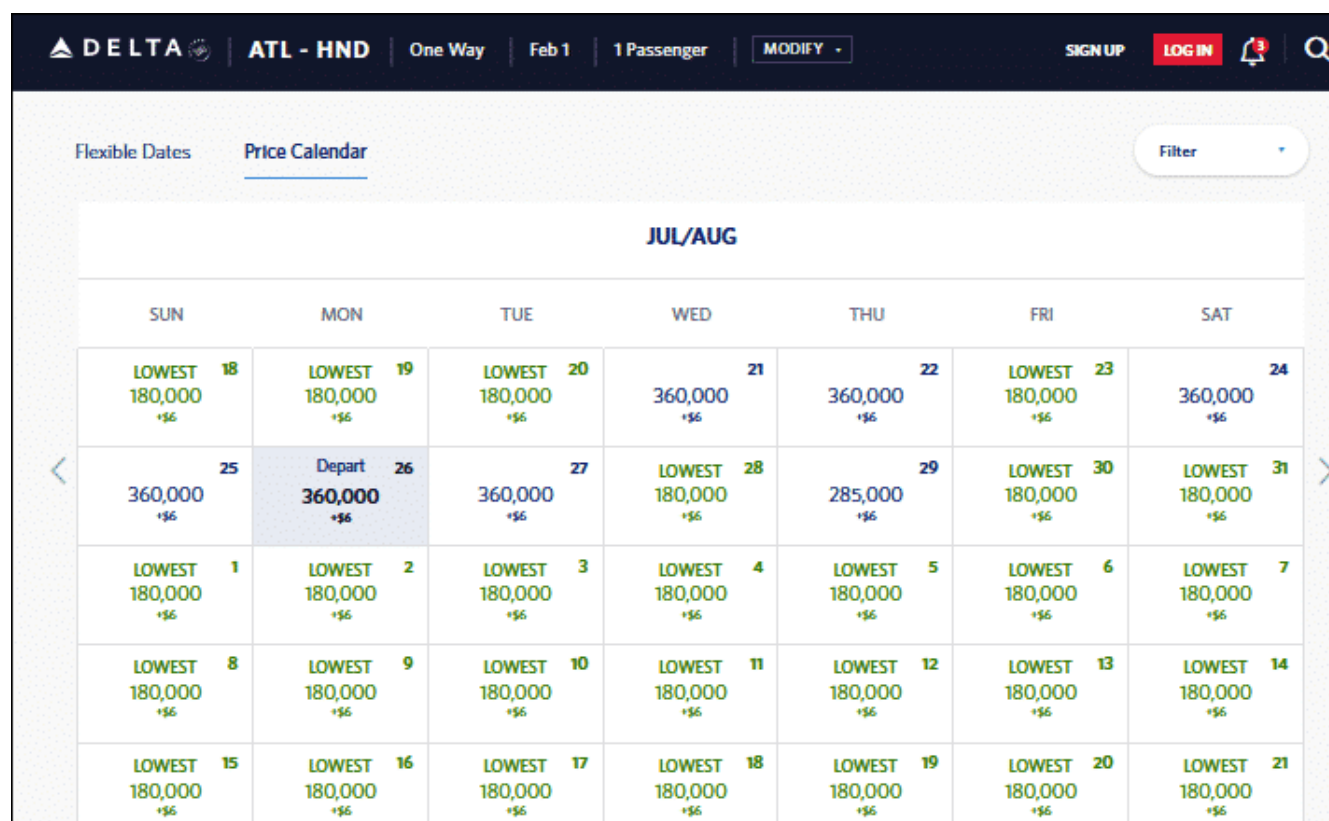
HOW AMEX & CHASE POINTS PLAYERS CAN PAY 67% LESS FOR DELTA-OPERATED FLIGHTS THAN DELTA SKYMILES MEMBERS DO

Ouch!

What the heck?! Although it sounds crazy, it's true. Here's why: Delta only releases a small number (if any) of low-priced mileage award seats to Asia, forcing you to settle for full-priced options (in the 320,000 to 640,000 miles territory). But here's the catch... **using Virgin Atlantic miles for the same Delta flights/routes can open up low-priced saver award space that Delta doesn't offer SkyMiles members.**

DELTA'S GIFT TO VIRGIN

Delta SkyMiles **one-way** tickets to Asia usually cost 180,000 miles and up to 360,000 — double ouch! — on Delta-operated flights, as the screen below attests.

On the other hand, Virgin Atlantic (an Amex and Chase points transfer partner) offers **one-way** flights to Asia for just 60,000 miles on Delta-operated flights, as shown below.

HOW TO BUY MILES

If you don't have enough miles, you can buy them for as low as \$3,036 round-trip (includes about \$36 in award tax). The lowest published fare Los Angeles to Shanghai is currently \$13,497, netting you a huge savings of \$10,461 (77%). And FYI, you can buy Amex Membership Reward points for 2.5 cents each and transfer them to Virgin Atlantic. Chase and Citi points also transfer to Virgin Atlantic miles.

HOW TO SEARCH FOR DELTA FLIGHTS BOOKABLE ONLINE USING VIRGIN ATLANTIC MILES

You don't have to create a Virgin Atlantic mileage account to check for availability. However, if you are booking award seats, then you'll have to log in. [Just go to](#) "Book" and click "Advanced search." For more on searching for Delta flights, see our report [here](#) (the important information is about halfway down the page with the same header as above).

HOW TO ADD CONNECTING FLIGHTS

If you need to add extra flights to the nonstop Delta flight that has good availability, you'll have to spend more miles. A one-way domestic (non-transcontinental) flight costs 22,500 more Virgin miles. More here on [how to book Delta connecting flights with Virgin miles](#).

SOME NEED-TO-KNOWS WHEN USING VIRGIN ATLANTIC MILES

RISKY TO BOOK WITH MILES?

Both [Virgin Atlantic and Delta](#) have a "travel fee waiver" currently offered for new bookings until the end of this year. This includes award flights. That means there won't be any fees to cancel your ticket.

Normal mileage award booking policies vary by airline, but you can generally redeposit or change your mileage ticket for as little as \$50. Details [here](#).

Think of the change and/or redeposit fee as an insurance policy. If your plans change and you decide not to travel, you can do so with very little hassle and cost. We think it's well worth it.

Get the Transcontinental crossing while the getting is good.

We have more good news on Transcontinental flights. Last month it was [United's Premium Transcon service for \\$837](#) round-trip, a couple of weeks ago we found nonstop First Class availability between Ft. Lauderdale and Los Angeles [for \\$582](#) round-trip, and two months ago it was American Airlines boasting 7+ seats on its premium Transcon flights for 200+ days of the year for a [ridiculously low 40,000 miles round-trip](#).

Phew. That's a lot of great numbers in one paragraph.

But the good news doesn't end there. In this report we'll cover the latest opportunities on American and United, and also revisit why Delta travelers are still being left out on the wing.

If you have an anniversary, birthday, or any other firm dates or reasons for crossing the country, then now might be a good opportunity for you.

UNITED'S NEW SERVICE

Let's start with United, which just announced that it's returning to New York's JFK (in addition to continued service from Newark).

United's New York/JFK-Los Angeles and New York/JFK-San Francisco service begins February 1, 2021, both with two flights daily.

As shown in our Sweet Redeem alerts, both [New York-Los Angeles](#) and [New York-San Francisco](#) are available to book now in both directions most Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays at 70,000 miles r/t through May 26. Otherwise the regular rate is available at 100,000 miles r/t. **Not good.**

That's the same cost and almost exactly the same availability as both the Newark-Los Angeles and Newark-San Francisco routes.

United's Partner [Air Canada](#) offers the same flights for 50,000 miles r/t. **Not bad** if you want to burn points.

If you don't have miles, you can **transfer Amex points to Air Canada miles or Chase to United.**

AMERICAN PRICING VARIES, SO WATCH CAREFULLY

American Airlines pricing ranges from 40,000 to 42,000 miles round-trip most days of the week (vs. United's Tue/Wed/Sat), with some days as high as 82,500 miles in early May for both [New York-Los Angeles](#) and [New York-San Francisco](#).

The \$1,000 Difference Trend: Why Oneworld First Class Is a Superior Alternative

Seductive fares are calling to cross the pond...

Generally speaking, if I'm considering a route that's less than eight hours or so of flying, I'd choose Business Class that is nonstop over making a connection to ride in First Class.

That said, if there's no nonstop offered on that route, you know I'm going to prefer First Class.

That's where today's trend comes in. It works well at a lot of little airports where you'd have to make a connection anyway. So keep reading if you're flying to a city like Ibiza, Nice, or Valencia, and have to make a connection.

FIRST CLASS FARES TO EUROPE NORMALLY RUN \$7,000 TO \$17,000

First Class from New York to Paris on Air France runs \$7,305 right now. Meanwhile, SWISS and Lufthansa First Class fares to Europe typically run from \$7,000 to \$12,000. You get the picture. First Class isn't cheap.

Or is it...? *(Cue the dramatic movie music.)*

AMERICAN AND BRITISH AIRWAYS ARE TRENDING BETWEEN \$2,900 AND \$3,500 IN FIRST CLASS R/T ON MANY ROUTES

Let me first say that American Airlines and British Airways First Class isn't nearly as good as what you'll find on Air France, Lufthansa, or SWISS.

That said, if you're a Oneworld traveler, so what?! They aren't an option anyway. What makes this fare trend such a great deal is that First Class fares on American and BA are now only \$1,000 more than Business Class, and you end up with a much better seat.

SETTING THE TABLE FOR FIRST

That \$1,000 difference as you'll see in the table below, is pretty standard down to the dollar. Given the quality difference and the flight length, it's right in the sweet spot for choosing First Class over Business. The value seems undeniable, as these examples show.

FCF's renowned Leg Stretch Strategy is back, connecting Asia, South America, and you.

The Leg Stretch Strategy is the gift that keeps on giving. Usually, it connects Europe and South America via the U.S. for crazy-low prices, like a free ride in Business Class. It's typically best for East Coast flyers (and sometimes Midwesterners) simply due to the geography of the novel [two-trips-on-one-ticket](#) approach.

Well, now we've got some great news for West Coasters. Amidst all the lockdown distractions we've been experiencing, we've spotted a well-connected Leg Stretch route from Asia to South America via the U.S.

THE LEG STRETCH IN A NUTSHELL

The “Leg Stretch Strategy” (LSS) is FCF’s name for an outrageously inventive ploy where airlines connect three continents for an *extremely* low price, like \$3,672 in Business Class for four segments, which is equal to two round-trips. In today’s case, it connects Asia, South America, and the U.S.

So if you are planning to visit those other continents for business or pleasure, you end up saving thousands of dollars or getting the equivalent of **a free Business Class ticket**.

As the world unlocks, the LSS could be the perfect way to see the Olympic Games in Tokyo. Or the Andes in South America. You choose your preferred 2021 lockdown escapade.

We have 10 LSS example options here – using Chicago, Dallas, Miami, New York, Washington, DC, or San Francisco (thus our happy West Coasters) as the U.S. stop-offs.

The savings are stunning, as you’ll see detailed in the screenshots below. You could easily pay twice as much if you were to do those same trips separately. The LSS is a gift from Mr. Upgrade.
